

Alfred G Bracciano, EdD, MSA, CPAM, OTR/L, FAOTA, FAIS is a clinician and academician with over 30 years of clinical practice and research. He is an Associate Professor at Creighton University and Coordinator of the Entry Level Distance Pathway at the University of Alaska Anchorage. He is the Founding Chair & Professor of the Occupational Therapy Program at Saginaw Valley State University, MI, an Associate Clinical Professor, Stony Brook University, NY; and has appointments as a Visiting Professor, Jinan University, Guangzhou, China and Yonsei University, Seoul, South Korea. He is a Fellow in the American Occupational Therapy Association (AOTA) for his work in China and in education. Dr. Bracciano lectures extensively on physical agents, orthopedics and hybrid distance education nationally and internationally. He is the author of *Physical Agent Modalities: Theory and Application for the Occupational Therapist* (2nd ed), Slack, Inc., authored numerous chapters on physical agent modalities and co-authored the AOTA Position Statement on Physical Agent Modalities (2003, 2008, 2012). He has also published and presented extensively on research related to hybrid distance education and outcomes. Dr. Bracciano serves as content expert and consultant to the American Occupational Therapy Association and the United States Department of Defense (DoD), U.S. Army. Dr. Bracciano has been a vocal advocate in the appropriate use and application of physical agent modalities and assisted a number of states and organizations develop licensing and regulatory guidelines related to their use. Dr. Bracciano serves on several editorial boards and reviewer including *American Journal of Occupational Therapy*, *British Journal of Occupational Therapy*, *Journal of Rural Health*, the *Chinese Journal of Clinical Rehabilitative Tissue Engineering Research*, and the *Journal of Athletic Medicine*.
